1 Thessalonians 5:13 – MESSAGE

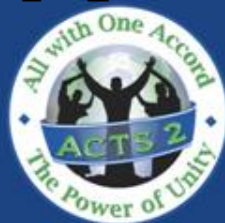
Overwhelm them with appreciation and love!

And he said, ‘A hundred measures of oil.’ So he said to him, ‘Take your bill, and sit down quickly and write fifty.’



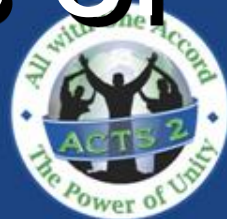
Luke 16:7 – NKJV
